1 double berth, saloon (with one single fixed sofa/bed, galley, separate shower with a sea and chemical toilet.

Other Information

Served in the Admiralty in Chatham 1909 – 1928/1932 research taking place to ascertain whether part of the little ships flotilla at Dunkirk. The Pinnaces attached to the Royal Navy were the fleet's maids of all work and of the 634 on the Navy List of 1913, this vessel is 1 of only 3 remaining (awaiting confirmation of this fact).

Hull - Double skin teak, fore and aft planking externally and diagonal internally. The transom is Elm, keel Rock Elm and Oak, upright timbers streamed Rock Elm and oak. Three full length stringers per side. Hull largely original, deck, superstructure and accommodation date from the eighties.
